Introduction

Dear parishioners,

It is my pleasure to introduce the Parish Accounts for the year 2023. As always, I am extremely grateful to each and every person for the contribution you make to parish life, whether that be financial as reported here, or spiritual or practical through the generous offering of your time and talents; all given in the service of the Gospel and the mission to which Jesus calls us personally and as a community. I'd like to take this opportunity to thank all the members of the Parish Finance Committee for their hard work in helping look after our finances, and particularly to Caroline Battersby for her hard work in putting this report together. I hope this report gives you the information you need to feel confident that your generosity is received gratefully and used wisely. Financial transparency is crucial if we are to encourage every member of the parish to take personal responsibility for their part in the life of the Church. We want you to know how your contributions are used, not only in the upkeep of our buildings, but in the building up of a community engaged in mission.

In the autumn of last year we held our Parish Stewardship Drive where we reflected on the goodness of God in the many blessings we receive, and on our responsibility to use those gifts wisely and for good purposes. Later in these pages you'll see some good news about how income has increased as a result. Some people, too, stepped forward to offer their time in support of one or other activities in the parish. Let's thank God together for all the ways in people felt able to respond. The three-week co-ordinated drive isn't something we'd plan to do every year, but the principles behind it are important to keep always at the forefront of our minds: God's goodness is entrusted to us so that we might make the Gospel of his love more widely known.

As we review the last year and thank God for his blessings, I'd ask you regularly to reflect on the question: is God calling me to offer of my time, talent or treasure in a new way? 2023 YEAR END REPORT

You will see from the figures that our expenditure as of late has exceeded our income. This is unsustainable and is only possible due to reserves gifted to us as a parish over the years. Whilst costs have increased overall, energy charges are now one of our major expenses; in 2023's accounts this amounted to £24,462, however, due to a changeover in Diocesan supplier we did not not receive Electricity invoices from July 2023 until this year, adding a further £4,658 which will be reflected in 2024 accounts.

*The deficit for 2023 is largely accounted for by the necessary rebuilding of the wall to Haltwhistle Cottage which was in danger of collapse, amounting to £60,345.

Additional Expenditure

To improve facilities at St Anthony's for groups such as Life in the Spirit seminars, the Diocesan *Invited!* Programme and other events, a new fridge, tables and television were purchased at a cost of £1,002.

To meet increased demand and use of the Parish Centre kitchen for homeless breakfasts, Sunday Tea/Coffee, Alpha etc. a second dishwasher was installed at a cost of £437.

Other equipment purchased includes an additional screen in the Sacred Heart Chapel as an aid to greater utility of the cameras for livestreaming, particularly for funerals, weddings and Holy Communion celebrations (\pounds 795). Music equipment (\pounds 464) and a replacement TV for the Parish centre (\pounds 479).

New Income Streams

Excluding the wall costs, the deficit has reduced over the past two years through new income streams. In light of the decision for Bognor Regis and Slindon to be served by only one priest, house and office space became vacant. Priory Cottage has been rented to the L'Arche community and the vacant office in the Parish Centre has been rented to a local builder, providing an income of £18,480. Hire of the parish hall has also increased with an income of £2,567.

Thank you to all parishioners who responded so generously to our Stewardship Drive in the October. Much of this has now become apparent in 2024: the amount donated by standing order has increased by 24% over the five month period January to May compared to the same period in 2023 from £24,896 to £30,892. In addition, around 20 more parishioners also signed up for Gift Aid. This is a significant source of income, in 2023 we recovered £16,743 from the Government, these additional Gift Aid donations will really make a difference.



Budget 2024

In 2023 our five yearly survey (Quinquennial) was undertaken which highlighted a number of areas that will need to be addressed in the structure of our churches. These works will be carried out over the next 5 year period according to urgency and financed from reserves.

The budget for day to day expenditure aims to be financed solely from investment dividends, rental income and your individual giving.


Parish Income 2023

When I was first invited to join the Knights, I was quite apprehensive of what they (we) did and whether I would find my place there. However, the meetings have been a great experience. To have a place to pray and put faith into action with others has been a real game-changer for me.

Here in Bognor, the Knights are involved in a range of outreach ministries, from prison visiting to pro-life advocacy. Being part of causes like these has given me a real confidence boost. It's encouraged me to step out of my comfort zone, get to know other members of the parish, and to feel more confident in sharing my faith with those who haven't yet responded to Jesus' good news.

Responding to the call of Jesus

"I first joined the Parish Community of Bognor & Slindon when my daughter joined St Mary's Primary School. It was clear from the outset that the school, and the parish by extension, was a warm, loving and faith filled community. My daughter was embraced by her teachers and peers in all aspect of school life and, even though we did not go to church as a family, it soon became clear that she valued the faith life of the school above all else.

When she was in year 6, my daughter asked me and her mum if she could be baptised. Naturally, we wanted to support her in her journey of faith as best we could.
